12 I'm trying to look at his face and I know he was a black
13 male because the hood was over his face so it was dark.
14 Dark black hood around his face and the face inside the hood
15 was dark. I couldn't see. So dark and darkness of skin is
16 something that witnesses have told you again and again.

17 A distinguishing characteristic that cannot be changed
18 and has been talked a lot about in this case, eyes. Eyes.
19 The same description of eyes has been threaded throughout
20 this case. And you can complain and you can say: Well, you
21 didn't say red in your statement and you didn't put red in
22 the first police -- when the police first talked to you, but
23 when you go through your notes and what witnesses said over
24 and over again was: When I looked at this guy, I noticed
25 his eyes. His eyes his were wide. His eyes were wide open.
