2 A. I do.

3 Q. Could you please identify him.

4 A. The man sitting at defense table in the dark-colored
5 suit.

6 Q. All right.

7 MR. MASTROIANNI: Your Honor, may the defense -- may
8 the record reflect that he was pointing towards defense
9 table in Mr. Kirkland's position?

10 THE COURT: Yes, it may.

11 Q (By Mr. Mastroianni) Did you come to know the
12 individual's name?

13 A. I do.

14 Q. And who is that?

15 A. Tamik Kirkland.

16 Q. And what did he look like when he was taken out of the
17 trunk; in other words, physically was he hurt?

18 A. Was he hurt?

19 Q. Yes.

20 A. Yes. He was struck by several rounds at that point.

21 Q. You don't remember the color of shirt he had on?

22 A. No, I have no idea.

23 Q. Do you remember his hairstyle?

24 A. Cornrows.

25 Q. He had cornrows?

- 1 A. Uh-huh.
- 2 Q. Did he have shoes on?
- 3 A. He had shoes on when I saw him in the trunk.
- 4 Q. The firearm that you took from him --
- 5 A. Yes.
- 6 Q. -- what do you remember about the firearm?
- 7 A. It was a black small pistol, Millennium. Millennium
- 8 being the model.
- 9 Q. Okay. Do you have familiarity with firearms?
- 10 A. Cursory, somewhat, just from being a police officer,
- 11 yes.
- 12 Q. You have been trained with them?
- 13 A. Yes.
- 14 Q. And you continually go for retraining on firearms; is
- 15 that correct?
- 16 A. I do.
- 17 Q. And you are taught how to fire several types of
- 18 firearms, is that right?
- 19 A. Yes.
- 20 Q. Are you taught how to clear a firearm, load and unload?
- 21 A. Yes.
- 22 Q. Officer, I'm going to approach you with this firearm
- 23 and ask you -- are you comfortable with assuring that it's
- 24 cleared and that it's not loaded?
- 25 A. Absolutely.
